This is to inform you that effective immediately, you are prohibited from entering in or upon the property of _____ Maynard, MA 01754

Massachusetts General Law, Ch. 266/120 states "Entry upon private property after being forbidden as trespass: Arrest."

Whoever, without right, enters or remains in or upon the dwelling house, buildings, boats, or improved or enclosed land, wharf or pier of another, after having been forbidden to do so by the person who has lawful control of said premises, whether directly or by notice posted thereon, or in violation of a court order pursuant to section thirty-four B of Chapter two hundred and eight or section four of Chapter two hundred and nine A, shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days, or both. Proof that a court has given notice in such a court order to the alleged offender shall be *prima facie* evidence that the notice requirement of this section has been met. A person who is found committing such trespass may be arrested by a sheriff, deputy sheriff, constable or police officer and kept in custody in a convenient place, not more than twenty-hours, Sunday excepted, until a complaint can be made against him/her for the offense, and be taken upon a warrant issued upon such complaint.

Any attempt on your part to trespass in or upon these premises will result in immediate police action for your removal from said property. Charges will be filed against you for trespass and you will be criminally prosecuted.
