## Incidents

On April 17<sup>th</sup>, Maynard Police Department responded with the Maynard Fire Department to a structure fire at 17 Nick Lane. Thankfully all occupants were safely evacuated prior to the arrival of Police and Fire. Maynard Police Department has been conducting routine area checks of the scene. Excellent work by Maynard Fire Department!

On April 26<sup>th</sup> at approximately 3:30 PM, Officer Comeau and Officer Brennan responded to a report of a hit and run motor vehicle accident. Officers were able to locate the striking vehicle that fled the scene. Through a series of field sobriety tests it was determined the operator, who was also an Uber driver, was intoxicated. The operator was placed under arrest and charged with OUI, Negligent Operation of a Motor Vehicle, and Leaving Scene of Property Damage.

## Training

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, Detective Sweeney and Officer Manchuso attended the New England School Safety Conference in Norwood. The Officers were presented with information on drug trends in schools, bullying and social media.

On April 19<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> Communications Supervisor Finnerty attended an IMC Police System Manager training. IMC is the CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch) and Records management system that is used by Maynard Police and Fire Departments to track calls for service and much more!

April 24<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> Detective Sweeney and Officer Sutherland attended the National Cyber Crime Conference held in Norwood. Throughout the three day training these Officers attended various classes highlighting cyber crime issues, social media, open source intelligence and child exploitation.

On April 26<sup>th</sup>, the Maynard Police Department hosted the NEMLEC (Northeastern Massachusetts Law Enforcement Council) SWAT firearms training at the Maynard Rod and Gun Club. The NEMLEC SWAT team is made up of Officers from participating Police Departments, and can be utilized by agencies if needed. Maynard Police Department's Sergeant Duggan is a part of the NEMLEC SWAT team.

On April 28<sup>th</sup>, Dispatcher Walsh attended Rapid Intervention for the Public Safety Dispatcher, held by the MFA (Massachusetts Fire Academy) to further her training for the Maynard Fire Department.

This month, Officer Manchuso tried out for, and was accepted into the NEMLEC RRT (Regional Response Team). NEMLEC RRT is deployed in missing persons situations, crowd control and provides the outer perimeter for SWAT deployments.
