Community Outreach

On April 9th, Sergeant Duggan held another Basic Firearms Safety Course here at the Maynard Police Department. The course is free to Maynard residents, we have another class scheduled for June 3rd (which has been filled already!). A second class will be added this summer.

Unfortunately, there continue to be scam phone calls to our residents. The latest report we have received is that a phone number with "Town of Maynard" will display and attempt to gain personal information about you. Please be incredibly careful when issuing ANY personal information over the telephone. The scam phone calls become more and more sophisticated every day.

The Maynard Police Department, and Maynard Public Safety Communications are proud to announce their Missing Kids Readiness Project certification through the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC). Communications Supervisor Finnerty attended a course at NCMEC in May 2017, and subsequently Communications and the Police Department completed hours of training required to achieve this certification.

Maynard High School student Maggie Brennan has focused her senior project on the development of relationships between the youth in the community and the Maynard Police Department.
