Incidents

On July 10th, Officer Davoll took a report of a backpack that had been stolen from a vehicle on Acton Street. The backpack contained electronics and tools valued at approximately \$400.00. Officers Davoll and Comeau searched the Rail Trail, but were unable to locate the backpack or items that it contained. Detective Bodwell viewed camera footage in the area, unfortunately the incident was not captured on camera.

On July 11th Officer Moore responded to a report of a fraudulent check that was written from a business account. Through the investigation with Detective Bodwell, the Officers were able to determine that the check was written by a former business partner. The matter is on going and being dealt with in court.

On July 23rd, an employee of Advanced Auto Parts on Powder Mill Road reported that for the past two years someone had been bending the lid to the locked dumpsters in the parking lot and dumping trash inside. As of late, the items had been increasing larger. The employee requested assistance in speaking with the parties involved and requesting that they no longer dispose of trash in the dumpster.
