## Incidents

The Maynard Police Department investigated anti-Semitic language that was allegedly shouted at political campaign canvassers. On Tuesday, May 7, 2019, a Maynard Police Officer was met in the lobby of the police station by a resident who is running for local political office. The resident stated that they have been actively campaigning and canvassing in Maynard with a group of supporters. On the morning of Saturday, May 4 a group of supporters was canvassing on Nason Street near Summer Street when a vehicle drove past them and a passenger yelled an anti-Semitic statement at the group. The candidate was not present at the time, but three supporters were canvassing when the car drove past. Maynard Police have spoken with the supporters and are seeking the public's assistance in identifying the vehicle and individual suspected in this incident.

On May 27<sup>th</sup>, the Maynard Police Department received numerous calls in regards to low flying aircraft in Maynard. This was in relation to a search for a female in Acton, Maynard Police Officers assisted.

James McGrath, a former Maynard Public Safety Dispatcher and Jordan Blackington a former Maynard Police Department Special Officer were sworn in as Police Officers. They have entered the Lowell Police Academy, and will begin their Field Training upon completion of the academy. Congratulations!
