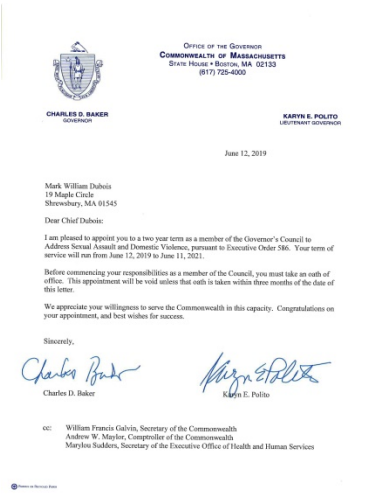

After being extricated, the female was transported to an area hospital for treatment.
