Incidents

On January 4th, Officer Petersen and Officer Blackington responded to a report of a hit and run motor vehicle accident. It was reported that a grey SUV struck a telephone pole and left the area. Officers located a parts of a side mirror and door handle which belonged to a 2013 Ford Edge, the area was searched with negative findings. The matter is under investigation.

On January 15th, Maynard Public Safety Communications received a report of a large water main break on Nason Street. The DPW was notified and able to stop and repair the break.

On January 6th, the Maynard Police Department received a complaint of crews working at 129 Parker Street after the hours that are permitted. The crew was advised that this was a violation and would be documented.

On January 8th, a McDonald's Restaurant employee reported that someone had passed a counterfeit \$10.00 bill. Officer Comeau spoke with the individual that passed the bill, and he was unaware that it was counterfeit, the remainder of the bill was paid. The matter has been resolved.

On January 14th, the Maynard Police Department received a report of a vehicle that struck the CVS building. Officers responded, and Maynard Fire Department was dispatched due to air bag deployment. The operator reported that he pressed the gas pedal accidentally rather than the brake. The building inspector was notified to view the damage.
