# Incidents

On October 1st, 2019 Detective Manchuso and Officer Hyde responded to 129 Parker Street for a report of vandalism to an apartment building that is under construction. There were several broken windows as well as a broken exterior light. A supervisor for the project would be reviewing the camera footage, and a report was filed.

On October 18<sup>th</sup>, 2019 Officer Ruggiero responded to Digital Way for a Fire Alarm. The property superintendent approached Officer Ruggiero and reported there were three microwave glass dishes were broken. There were no cameras in the immediate area, but extra checks were requested due to several incidents at the construction site.

A resident reported that her cell phone was no longer working, and that Verizon informed her that her phone number had been stolen and was now being used with another carrier. This individual also reported that several other accounts had been compromised, she was advised to make her bank aware of the on-going issue. A report was provided to the resident to assist in resolving the matter.

On October 28th, 2019, the owner of Subway reported an abandoned bicycle had been left outside of the establishment. Ofc. Petersen retrieved the bicycle, unable to locate the owner it has been stored for safe keeping at the Maynard Police Department.
