# Incidents

On April 12<sup>th</sup>, Mill and Main Place Security reported graffiti on three windows of 5 Mill and Main Place. The graffiti was documented.

On April 14<sup>th</sup>, a resident reported that she received an email from a friend's account requesting that she purchase a \$200.00 Amazon gift card, which was done. After receiving a second email requesting an additional card be purchased, she notified the Police as she believed she was being scammed.

On April 23<sup>rd</sup>, a resident reported that she received an email demanding \$2,000.00 in bitcoin or an inappropriate video would be released (no such video existed). Additionally, Netflix and Hulu accounts had been compromised. The resident was advised to change all passwords and place a fraud alert on all her credit.

On April 25<sup>th</sup>, Officers responded to 129 Parker Street for a by-law violation. The incident was documented, and the crew was notified.

On April 27<sup>th</sup>, a large tree fell across Parker Street with power lines. The overnight shift secured the roadway until utility crews arrived on scene.
