Incidents

After 36 years of service to the Maynard Police Department, Officer Karl Nyholm retired.

In late June, a Maynard resident suffering from memory issues was reported as overdue and missing. Immediately, the individual was entered as missing into the NCIC database, BOLO's were given out to all communities in Massachusetts, and a Silver Alert issued was issued by the Massachusetts State Police. Through diligent work by the Detective, Officers, Dispatchers and the NYPD the resident was located. She was in good health, and reunited with her family.
